Be prepared. Children go missing every day.

The Michigan Child ID Program provides parents and guardians with a "Child ID Kit" that contains all the vital information necessary to expedite law enforcement efforts to locate a missing child. The program also helps to educate families about abduction prevention and safety.

Most comprehensive. Everything for an Amber Alert.

In a matter of minutes, you'll walk away with a "Child ID Kit" that includes everything needed for the Amber Alert system (and more). In fact, it's considered to be one of the most comprehensive child recovery and identification programs in the nation by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.

Free service. Events all over Michigan.

This service is provided free of charge to Michigan children and their families with Child ID events scheduled throughout the year and around the state. The "Child ID Kit"

The Michigan Child ID Program is simple and only takes about 10 minutes per child to complete. Children progress through a series of stations where the latest techniques and computer technology are used to record a child's unique characteristics. Once completed, each child will have their own "Child ID Kit" that includes:

Photo ID Card: for parents or guardians to carry.

Color Photo: for circulation by police to media throughout the state within minutes of a reported abduction.

Digital Fingerprints: a complete set of laser-scanned fingerprints.

Recorded Interview: to capture speech, appearance, mannerisms, and other characteristics that can't be changed by cosmetic means.

Toothprints® Dental Impression: to record the unique size, shape, and position of teeth in the mouth.

DNA: from cheek cells in saliva, universally considered one of the most accurate identification tools.

Dog Scents: saliva also provides an exclusive trace scent for trained canine search and recovery teams.

Amber Alert Profile: a complete profile of information required for law enforcement to issue an Amber Alert.

No identification information is kept by the Michigan Masons.

It is recommended that families update their Child ID Kits every two years.



PRIVACY POLICY: All materials gathered during the Michigan Child ID Program are given to the parents or guardians upon completion. No identification information is kept, copied, or given to any governmental authority, unless the parent or guardian chooses to do so in an emergency. The Michigan Child ID Program keeps only a copy of the signed permission slip.
