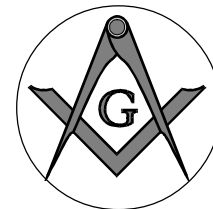

Brothers,

Business Meetings:

gram that provides a valuable service to our community. This next year I would like to reach out to our community to an even greater extent. For this reason I have created a Charity/Community committee consisting of two Brothers whose primary function will be to identify needs in the community and evaluate them as far as their necessities may require and our ability permit. We will then recommend to the Brothers of the Lodge an activity that we can all participate in.

During November of this year for example, several Brothers worked at God's Helping Hand (GHH) in Rochester sorting clothes and packing food for those in our community that are less fortunate. Many also participated in the annual Christmas Family Shopping Day at GHH where over 400 needy families were helped. In addition, several Brothers worked one Friday evening at Grace Centers of Hope preparing and serving dinner to the residents of the Center. It was a very rewarding experience for everyone who participated. I would like us to do more activities like this during the year. If any of the Brothers have any suggestions as to where our services could be best put to use, please step forward and let us hear your ideas! If possible I would like to schedule one Community or Charitable event every other month.

Fundraising:

This year I have 2 fundraising events currently scheduled at "The River" Charity Poker Lounge in Utica on (June 30 – July 3 and November 3-6). The location is on the SE corner of 22 Mile and Van Dyke (in the same parking lot as Nicks 22nd Street Steakhouse). I believe that these fundraising events will provide some much needed revenue for the Lodge and will provide us with some financial flexibility. The Fundraising Committee consisting of four Brothers will be calling upon each of you when the time gets close and ask that you assist us with these events and participate in at least one night, hopefully more. I have also been

informed of another venue at M-59 & Hayes that just recently opened. I will be contacting them shortly to see if they might have any dates available in late March early April. Participating in these events is easy and fun and also provides a good cash flow into the Lodge. More information will be provided as we get closer.

Visiting and assisting other Lodges:

As with many of our Past Masters there have always been requests made to visit and assist other Lodges, both within our District, and outside; I am no different. We have been very fortunate this past year in that we almost always have had visiting Brethren during our Business meetings or on a Degree night. We need to reciprocate more and get to know the Brothers at other Lodges and assist them if needed. As much as we appreciate their assistance, I know they would appreciate ours. So let's all make a concerted effort this year to step up and out and show our support to our Brothers.

Degree Work:

We have come a long way in our Degree work this past year under the direction of Past Master Chris Peace. I would also like to continue down this road and I encourage each Brother to learn as much as he can. Straight memorization can be difficult, but I have found if you really read the words and understand what they are trying to convey it is much easier to learn. I think this is where our Quarry nights play an important role in "learning" the ritual not just memorizing it.

Standing Investigation Committee

Establish a Standing Investigation Committee for 2012. I feel that when we ask for volunteers during a meeting many Brothers are not comfortable volunteering for this because they may have never participated in one before.

For anyone that would be interested I would ask our Lodge Education Officer to hold a class one night to go over what should be included in an interview or background investigation of a

candidate. Upon receipt of a Petition, and an affirmative vote, we would just turn over the Petition to the Committee. I would request 3 Brothers to step into this role if possible. I know we don't need 3, but that will provide some flexibility should there be a schedule conflict with one of the other members on the committee. We may still have to ask for a volunteer from time to time, but I think this would really expedite the whole process. If anyone is interested in joining this Investigation Committee please let me know.

Regardless of what events may be taking place, or that what committees or groups we may be involved in, it is extremely important that we support each other and that we learn from each other. We have many years of Masonry contained within our Lodge. Many of our Brothers have been in Masonry for thirty, forty, or fifty years! Take advantage of their wisdom and experience, ask questions and seek their counsel. This kind of information you cannot find in a book.

Lastly, I would ask that if it is within the length of your cable tow that you attend as many meetings or events as you can this next year. You will not be disappointed I assure you. For the Brothers who can no longer make it to Lodge, you are still in our thoughts and prayers. We miss you and if we can help you in any way please reach out to any us.
